- personal expenses



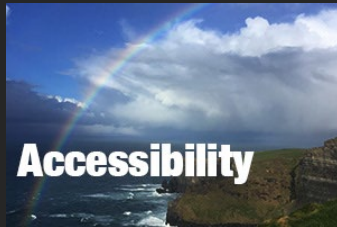
# Financial Aid & Scholarships

- **Residual aid from the academic year can apply to summer**
  - Students taking at least 6 credits during the summer are eligible for a Summer Pell Grant and Gilman scholarship
- **Scholarships**
  - **Bufs Abroad:** students with financial need are guaranteed an award!:
  - **PWR Writing Scholarship** (based on financial need for students who haven't traveled outside North America)
