Faculty Director Jota Samper, Assistant Professor for the Program on Environmental Design, has been leading education abroad programs in Colombia since 2008. A native of Medellín, he has been living in the United States for 17 years, which has prepared him to serve as an excellent cultural translator between the U.S. and local Colombian culture. He is an architect, urban designer, and planner whose work concentrates on sustainable urban growth and dwells at the intersection between urban informality ("slums") and violent urban conflict. As a researcher of informality in Medellín, he is very familiar with the history, diverse locales, and people of the city.



Academics










- Breakfast and dinner provided each day










COVID-19 & Education Abroad
