- Walking (on roads and cobblestones), sometimes for several hours each day.





Ed Abroad Finances

- Costs vary by program. Don't pay CU tuition, pay an Ed Abroad program fee
- On summer programs, residual aid from the academic year can apply if you are taking a minimum of 6 credits
- Students taking at least 6 credits during the summer can now be eligible for a Summer Pell Grant.
- All students with financial need are guaranteed a Buffs Abroad scholarship
- Additional Ed Abroad scholarships available!
