Meet the Director

Marianne Holbert, AIA, is an Assistant Clinical Professor in the Program in Environmental Design and a licensed architect. Marianne was on the design team with Workshop8 for the Paisano Green Community, the first net-zero, fossil fuel free & LEED platinum affordable housing complex in the nation. Marianne is the recipient of multiple grants for her community outreach project, Experiencing the Three Legged Stool: Social, **Economic and Environmental** Education Through the Mariposa Project.





Rome

- Rome is located in the centralwestern portion of the Italian Peninsula, on the Tiber River, within the Lazio region of Italy. Rome's history spans over two and a half thousand years.
- Rome offers several specific

development sites which encompass Roman and non-Roman cultural groups, as well as challenges in integrating new urban-scale development within heritage sites in a sustainable way.




Academics

The program has two great courses:

"Layers of Rome," which traces the architectural history of Rome and its buildings from the height of the Roman Empire to present day. This is an onsite architectural history course taught by faculty from the ACCENT Center.

"Urban Site Analysis & Design," an interdisciplinary studio, focused on site analysis and design in the Porta Portese in Rome. You will visit designated sites around Rome to conduct site analysis and look at physical, socioeconomic, and historical factors in the urban landscape. Design proposals focus on the Porta Portese in Rome.



Academic Credit 9 total credits:

- Urban Site Analysis and Design (6 credits)
- The Layers of Rome: A Survey of Architecture, Planning & Community (3 credits)
 - Approved for: ENVD Elective course, ENVD Specialization Elective course, Engineering: Humanities/Social Sciences
- Survival Italian Course (noncredit)

Both Layers and Studio courses are required and work in tandem to provide a thorough overview of Rome's history and architecture.



Academics

- The program is open to students of all majors
- Students from departments other than ENVD should speak with their academic advisor about academic credit.


Program fee does NOT include:

Financial Aid & Scholarships
