- Guest lecturers from leading local intellectuals and professors

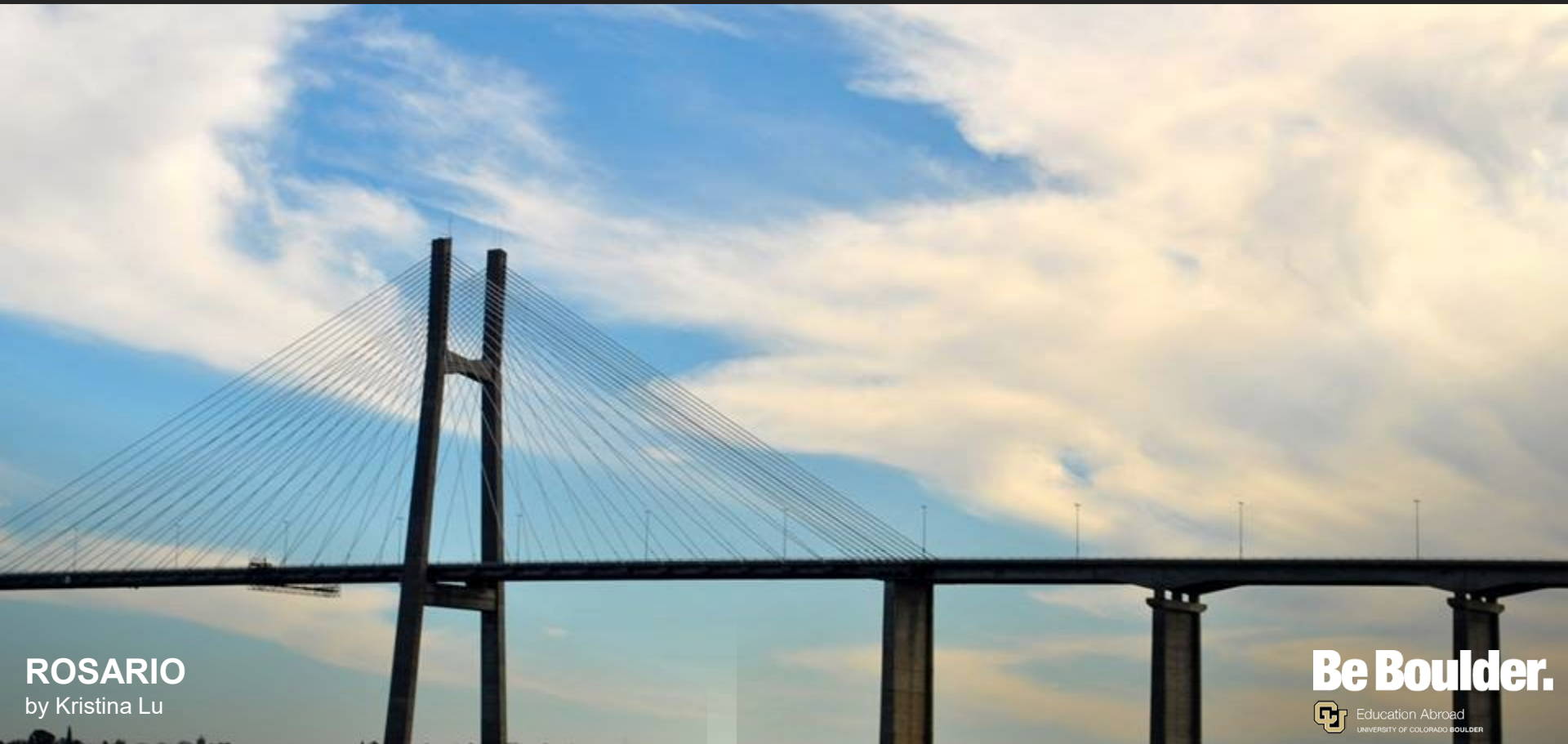
This year: **One week** in Buenos Aires and each day will include a culturally relevant excursion.

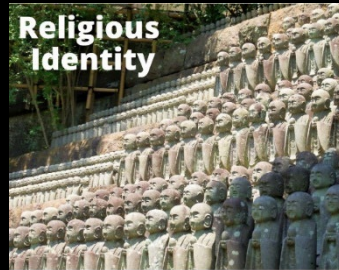
