

- February 1st Application deadline



Program fee includes:

- instructional costs
- housing & most meals
- field trips and most local transport
- health insurance
- administrative fees to CU Boulder Education Abroad office

Program fee does NOT include:

- round-trip travel to Dakar
- passport fees
- medical visit and anti-malarial pills
- personal expenses

Financial Aid & Scholarships

- Residual aid from the academic year can apply to summer
 - Students taking at least 6 credits during the summer can now be eligible for a Summer Pell Grant.
