

Activities & Conditions

Global Seminar Finances

- Costs vary by program. Don't pay CU tuition, pay an Ed Abroad program fee
- On summer programs, residual aid from the academic year can apply if you are taking a minimum of 6 credits
- Students taking at least 6 credits during the summer can now be eligible for a Summer Pell Grant.
- Additional Ed Abroad scholarships available!
- Max Kade Scholarship for students studying in Germany or Austria. Award is \$1,200. Apply via Buffs Abroad
